Interests and Activities in Nursery

<u>Piglets</u>

The children are really enjoying playing in the tunnel at the moment and this interest will be extended to include making tunnels using large cardboard boxes and then introducing light-up toys into the tunnels. These activities encourage the children to crawl or bottom shuffle to move around and to explore new toys and environments, checking in regularly with an adult as and when needed. **Parent Participation** – Any donations of large cardboard boxes would help the children to experiment with different tunnels, thank you. Also we are in the process of developing a display in the role-play area relating to families, please could you bring in a photo of your child with their family for our display, thank you.

<u>Tiggers</u>

The children are enjoying a variety of jigsaw puzzles and insert puzzles at the moment and are working together in small groups to complete these puzzles. We will extend this interest by introducing more complex puzzles which will include shape and colour matching. These activities encourage the children to play co-operatively with others and to attempt successfully to fit shapes into spaces on inset boards or jigsaw puzzles.

Parent Participation – Any donations of unwanted jigsaw puzzles that you no longer use would be gratefully received, thank you.

Some of the children are showing an interest in small world dinosaurs and are looking at them in both fiction and non-fiction books. We will extend this interest by introducing a variety of activities including digging for bones in the sand tray, making dinosaur eggs with small dinosaurs in water filled balloons which are then frozen before the children investigate, making dinosaur scenes in the tuff spot and encouraging the children to compare the size of dinosaurs to everyday objects of today such

as a bus or cat. These activities encourage the children to experiment to create different textures, to order items by length or height and use language related to time.

Parent participation – Do you have a fossils at home? If so please could we borrow them so that we could show the children as it would be lovely for them to see real fossils and have discussions about these. We would be very grateful, and careful, with them, thank you.
