Interests and Activities in Nursery

<u>Piglets</u>

The children have been enjoying painting activities over the last few weeks and this interest will be extended by encouraging the children to join in with body painting using large pieces of paper and introducing cars and other toys to the paint for them to make different marks on the paper. These activities will enable the children to explore and experiment with a range of media through sensory exploration using their whole bodies.

Parent Participation - Have some fun joining in with some painting activities with you child at home. <u>Tiggers</u>

The children are continuing to enjoy a variety of puzzles and games and in particular shape games. We will extend this interest again by introducing new and varied jigsaws and games for the children to play with. These activities encourage the children to play co-operatively with others and to attempt successfully to fit shapes into spaces on inset boards or jigsaw puzzles.

Parent Participation – Help your child to recognise different shapes by talking about the shapes of objects in the environment.
