Interests and Activities in Nursery

<u>Roos</u>

The children have shown a lot of interest in different technology toys and books. We will extend this interest by introducing different sensory, musical and push button books, technology toys including posting, cause and effect and lights. We will also be playing a variety of different music from around the world and encouraging the children to dance. These activities will encourage the children to show attention to sounds, music and lights and to begin to understand the concept of cause and effect.

Parent participation – Create your own post box using a cereal or tissue box for your child to work out how to put objects into the box, retrieve them and put them back in again.

Piglets

The children are showing a lot of interest in physical activities such as an obstacle course, throwing beanbags as well as throwing and kicking balls. This interest will be extended to encourage turn taking on a variety of different obstacle courses, soft play, counting different movements such as skipping and jumping, throwing balls and beanbags into a target box and playing football. These activities will encourage the children to gradually gain control of their whole body through continual practice of large movements, such as, kicking, rolling, jumping etc. **Parent participation** – Play ball games with your child inside and/or outside, such as, football, throwing a ball into a box etc.

Tiggers

The children have been showing a lot of interest in different types of transport by investigating the constructions vehicles with soil and cereal and the train track within the nursery. We will be extending this interest by encouraging the children to talk about and draw how they come to nursery, we will also be carrying out traffic surveys in the local area. These activities will encourage the children to talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary. **Parent participation** – While you are out walking with your child talk about the different types and colours of transport that you see.

Christopher Robins

The children are showing an interest in dens and building with different blocks at the moment. We will extend this interest by encouraging the children to build their own dens, inside and outside, using different construction materials, tyres, boxes, large pieces of material etc. This will encourage the children to fit themselves into spaces like dens and boxes and to play with other children extending and elaborating play ideas.

Parent participation – Build dens at home with your child, maybe make a fort or a castle. If you have any unwanted large boxes we would be more than happy to use them in nursery, thank you.

Parent Information Evening – Thursday 23rd February 6:30pm to 7:30pm

Each year we hold a parent information evening covering a range of topics, this has had to change considerably over the last few years due to COVID. I am happy to announce that this year we will be running this event fully again. Topics that we cover at the information evening are school readiness, toilet training, behaviour management, communication and language, sleep, healthy eating and teething.
